

Frequently Asked Questions – 2018 Recreational Season

1. Divisions offered

In – House Divisions – Mixed – No Soccer July 2-5 for Honda Shut Down:

- **U5 (2013-2014)** – start week of May 28 for 10 weeks from 6:30 – 7:30pm – North & South regions - Monday and Central region - Wednesday
- **U6 – (2012)** - start week of May 28 for 10 weeks 6:30 – 7:30pm – North & South regions – Tuesday and Central region - Thursday

Inter League travel within our Club regions – 7:00pm start time - No Soccer July 2-5 for Honda Shut Down:

- **U8 Boys (2010-2011)** - start week of May 14 for 12 weeks – Monday practice and Wednesday game
- **U8 Girls (2010-2011)** - start week of May 14 for 12 weeks – Tuesday practice and Thursday game
- **U10 Boys (2008-2009)** - start week of May 14 for 12 weeks - Tuesday practice and Thursday game
- **U10 Girls (2008-2009)** - start week of May 14 for 12 weeks - Monday practice and Wednesday game
- **U12 Boys (2006-2007)** - start week of May 14 for 12 weeks - Thursday practice and Tuesday game
- **U12 Girls (2006-2007)** - start week of May 14 for 12 weeks - Monday practice and Wednesday game

Huron District Soccer League (HDSL) – travel within Simcoe County

- **U14– U18 Boys & Girls (2003 – 2001)** – start week of May 14

2. When will we be notified of a confirmed schedule from our Coach/SSU office?

- U5 & U6 – Should receive emails the week of May 14.
- U8-12– Should receive emails the week of May 7.
- U14-U18 - Should receive emails the week of Apr 30.

3. What does my registration fee cover? Registration and insurance with Ontario Soccer Association , jersey, shorts and socks (U5-U12), 2 shirts, shorts, socks (U14 – U18), a soccer ball, individual and team photo, year-end Awards Day on last night of program (U5 & U6), weekend Festival and year end event (U8 – U12).

4. Can my child request to play with another child, or play up a division?

Players cannot move up an age division as per new OSA rules.

We cannot guarantee requests to play with ONE other player, but will try and accommodate where possible. We do not refund when a request cannot be accommodated. This request will be considered if a player requesting to play with another does not create an unbalanced team.

5. What do I need to supply for my child to play soccer? Shin pads are mandatory and soccer cleats are recommended. You should also always provide a drink for your child at both games and practices and bring your ball to each practice.

6. How much travel is involved in the Travel League (HDSL- U14-18)? Half of these games will be played at home. Participating Clubs can include as an example SSU, Barrie, Bradford, Innisfil, Wasaga Beach, Orillia, Bracebridge, Collingwood, Parry Sound, etc. Not all teams travel to the same centers.

7. How much travel is involved in Inter League – U8-12? You will travel between the North, Central and South Regions of South Simcoe United.

8. Can my child play in a younger division? No child can be registered into a younger division except in the case of a disability where a Doctor's note has been provided. Once a Doctor's note is provided the Club then needs approval from Huronia District Soccer Association.

9. **Can my child play if he/she was born in 2015?** No, we do not accept registrations for any child born after Dec. 31 2014. There is no exception to this rule.
10. **How does my child become a referee?** The Entry Level Referee Clinic is for those who would like to become an accredited referee on 9v9 and 11v11 games and are 14 years of age (by March 31st, 2018) and older. By taking the clinic a referee is automatically registered for the 2017 season with the OSA and does not have to register again until the following year. - February 1- Regular priced registration, fees raised \$10 from Early Bird Discounted fee.
 - March 31- Regular priced registration Deadline.
 - April 1- Fees Raised \$10 to Regular priced registration fee.
 - May 14-24- U8-12- First 2 weeks will be evaluations to balance/put together teams
 - May 21- Victoria Day- U8-18- NO SOCCER (possibly excluding U14-18 games only)
 - June 23 - Team & Individual Photos- Times TBD @ Tottenham Community Centre
 - July 2-5- Honda Shutdown- U5-12- NO SOCCER
 - August 6- Civic Holiday- U5-18- NO SOCCER (possibly excluding U14-18 games only)
 - Week of August 6- U5 Central & U6 North/South/Central Year End Event (rain date following week)
 - August 13- U5 North & South Year End Event (rain date following week)
 - August 25- U8-12 Year End Event (rain date August 26)
